Upon graduating from college, I continued my education at MIT, where I not only obtained my Doctorate in Chemistry but also met my wife. Together, we rely on faith to ground our family and guide our personal and professional lives.

The three youngest brothers were only involved with Team Focus for a few years before the Team Focus California Chapter ran out of funding and had to end. Following are their stories:

The youngest Team Focus California member from this family is Kyle Brantley (age 21). Kyle joined the US Marines after high school graduation and is now going to school to be a prison guard. The next to the youngest Team Focus California member from this family is Marquis Brantley. Marquis is currently incarcerated. His brother Kyle, who is going to school to be a prison guard, has the determination to work with him and help him get through this to become a better person. The third youngest Brantley young man to go through the Team Focus California Chapter is Gilbert Brantley (Age 24). Gilbert is out in the working force and doing very well. Following are the updates of the other four brothers who were longtime California Team Focus members:



Kayon Brantley (age 26), graduated from the University of California Berkely on a full academic scholarship. He was also presented with the Vince Lombardi Award given by Lift Up America for Outstanding Ambassador for Compassion and Community Leadership. Kayon still lives in California and is doing very well.

Damien Brantley (age 28), received a degree in Computer Science from CSU (San Marcos) and is currently a software developer. He lives in Japan (which is no surprise as he was a foreign exchange student while in college). He has been in Japan for three years.





Davion Brantley (age 30), is currently a nurse. He stated: "Team Focus taught me a lot..... what it means to be a man, manners (which I still use) and to follow the proper path. It also taught me to be goal oriented."

Kenneth Brantley (age 32), works as a Mechanical Engineer and still lives in California.

An Encouraging Word from Bob Sebo - Team Focus Ohio Advisory Council Member



As I was reading the past Team Focus Newsletter and reading what everybody had to say, I felt I should pass on to you how God smiled on me this year.

On New year's Eve day (around 1:00 p.m.) I tested positive for the Covid-19 virus and by 5:00 p.m. I was admitted to Salem Regional Medical Center. The next morning (New Year's Day), I

had an x-ray and a cat scan that showed pneumonia. As you are probably aware of, it is dangerous when there is a combination of virus and pneumonia. In addition, I have asthma, diabetes and blood pressure issues. All of these things didn't bode well for the future of ol' Bob Sebo.

At 1:00 p.m. on New Year's Day, we found out that getting transferred to Cleveland Clinic would take 3-4 days. With prayers

and some of my friends who talked to the CEO at Cleveland Clinic, instead of 3-4 days, it only took 3-4 hours. By 5:00 p.m. I was in an ambulance on my way to the Cleveland Clinic.

After five days of Remdesivir, thank God they got a good handle on the pneumonia and the virus. I'm certain God intervened. I was able to come home on Monday at 6:00 pm. I was then quarantined in a bedroom at my house with a TV and a comfortable chair. My wife Linda brought me three meals a day.

I thank God for looking out for me. I felt during this God fearing experience (I'm absolutely certain), it was the right hand of God that I am able to sit here right now.



Since joining Team Focus, Nate has learned he is not the only boy that doesn't have a Dad. Some boys have lost their Dad in different ways; maybe like Nate's Dad, or by divorce or by other means their Dad cannot be there.

Nate has made friends through Team Focus, but most importantly we have grown to love the Team Focus family. They have already been through what Nate and I are going through and they welcomed us like family. They have helped us with coping, tutoring, and helping Nate just learn life skills through a man's point of view.....not just having to learn from Mom. Team Focus hosts mini-camps, classes, ACT prep, etc. Anything they can do within reason, they will do for every young man in the program to help them learn life skills and how to be successful in life, including preparing them for job interviews and even helping them find jobs.

Team Focus always stresses the importance of school/learning and preparing for the future, especially putting in the hard work it takes to be a good Christian man in this world. It means more to Nate for him to learn from guys that have been through life like him. No one can take his Dad's place, but these men sure help to fill that void. They help Nate to cope better and learn life lessons. They encourage Nate to come out of his comfort zone, and try to teach him to reach from within to do his very best and to trust God in decision-making.

Nate was given the opportunity to fly for the first time....thanks to Team Focus taking him to an Ohio Team Focus Summer Camp. He still talks about that experience, the flat tire is one of his favorite memories, ha ha!

Aaron and Derius not only mentor these boys, they are more like big brothers to Nate. He laughs and jokes with them and pulls pranks on them (friendly ones thankfully)! Nate's Dad loved to tell jokes and pull pranks and Aaron and Derius are helping keep that memory alive for Nate. They help him to stay focused and help remind him to be respectful and always lend a helping hand, something that is important for me as a Mom.

Coach Mike and Mrs. Mickey are Amazing! I am so grateful they listened to God's voice and started this program, Ms. Deloris is just as Amazing! She brought her boys up in Team Focus and keeps everything running smoothly for us Moms. She doesn't hesitate to help us if she can. Everyone in the Team Focus organization has always treated us like family, most importantly, they make sure God is in the middle of it all. That is most important to me.


